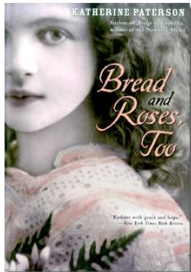

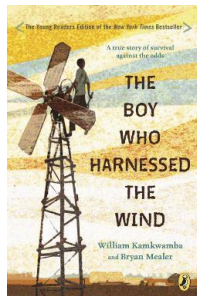

Jake, a "native-born," labors in the textile mills to purchase enough whiskey to keep his Pa from beating him. Italian immigrant Rosa goes to school, determined to make a better life for herself, while her mother and sister toil. Both Jake and Rosa are unwilling coattail participants in the labor action, the one carried along by co-workers, the other increasingly distressed by her striking mother's fervor, and both are equally unwilling evacuees to Barre, Vermont, as part of a program to help the children of the strikers

Cut off from the outside world, they faced hunger, boredom, the constant cruelties of living in confined quarters, and the ever-present threat of discovery and death. By turns thoughtful, moving, and amusing, her account offers a fascinating commentary on human courage and frailty and a compelling self-portrait of a sensitive and spirited young woman whose promise was tragically cut short.
